"How SUSTRANS can be relevant to Roundhay". SUSTRANS is the UK's leading sustainable transport charity, with many major new cycle routes and other transport initiatives created through its work. This is the chance to bring SUSTRANS to Roundhay. Discussions will cover:

- local cycle ways
- a local walking/cycling map
- connection with schools
- a boost to the REAP transport group.
